1. **Purpose.** To promulgate information concerning the Northmont Senior High School NJROTC Drill Meet to be conducted on 21 October 2017. Northmont Senior High School sponsors this meet. All correspondence and/or phone calls, 937-832-6004 x4170, or leave messages on voicemail at 937-832-6585 are to be directed to the Northmont Senior High School NJROTC Unit. The format of the drill meet will include coaching and teaching for each school participating.

Mail enclosures 2-4 back A.S.A.P or fax 937-832-6037. Scantrons will be sent out to the schools competing in the academics test if you do not have Scantron 882-E or Precision Data Products PDP-100 or equivalent. Let us know if you need these Scantrons ASAP. If not you will be required to transfer your answers to the appropriate Scantron at Northmont High School.

2. **Date.** Saturday, 21 October 2017, from 0900-1700. A commanders brief with all instructors will commence at 0830 in room 4100. There will be no opening ceremony. **PLEASE BE PRESENT AND ON TIME.**

3. **Location.** Northmont Senior High School, 4916 National Rd, Clayton, Ohio 45315. **Enter at Door 13**
4. **Cost.** \$80.00 per school. There is a maximum of one team per event. (with an exception of color guard) If a school just wants to participate in the Air Rifle (two teams maximum), Athletics and or Academic Postals the cost of each is \$10.00. Money will be used for awards and other competition expenses. Travel expenses are the responsibility of each Unit. Food will be available at the high school at a reasonable cost. Please use this service, as it is a fund raising activity for the cadets of Northmont. We will be serving both breakfast and lunch foods.

Parking at Northmont High School

1. Enter and exit only from the side Door 13 next to the Bolts Gym on the east side of the high school.
2. Buses will park in main parking lot off of National Rd (highway 40) behind the middle school.
3. Buses will follow our road guards on where to park in the parking lot.

Drill Meet Requirements

1. **OVERALL TROPHIES:** ONLY SCHOOLS WHO COMPETE IN ALL OF THE FOLLOWING COMPETITION EVENTS WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR OVERALL TROPHIES: Personnel Inspection; IDR Armed Platoon; IDR Unarmed Platoon; Color Guard (NS1 Squad Drill, Knock-out, Athletics, Air Rifle, and Academics will not be counted for Overall score). These units must be identified far enough in advance to allow those chosen sufficient time to:
 - a. Raise the necessary funds to attend the event.
 - b. Meet the minimum paperwork and timeframe deadlines set forth within this LOI.
 - c. LOI Drill Cards and Drill meet registration can all be accessed online at www.northmontnjrotc.com

A.Events and Awards.

IDR Platoon Drill (Unarmed)	1 st through 3 rd place trophies
IDR Platoon Drill (Armed)	1 st through 3 rd place trophies
Color Guard	1 st through 3 rd place trophies
NS1 Squad Drill (Unarmed)	1 st through 3 rd place trophies
Individual Unarmed Knockout	1 st through 5 th place medals
Individual Armed Knockout	1 st through 5 th place medals
Unit Personnel Inspection	1 st through 3 rd place trophies
Rifle Team Competition	1 st through 3 rd place trophies, 1 st through 5 th place medals for top shooters
Athletic Competition	1 st through 3 rd place trophies
Academic Competition	1 st through 3 rd place trophies, 1 st through 5 th for top scorers
Overall Trophies	1 st through 3 rd place trophies awarded to the Unit with most points from IDR Platoon Drill (Armed and Unarmed), Color Guard, and Unit Personnel Inspection.

2. Each school attending this event must be comprised of **UP TO 40 cadets total.** Teams may have fewer cadets but no team may have MORE than 40 total cadets competing for their school (not including rifle team members). A complete roster of cadets, use enclosure (4), shall be submitted to the SNSI or the NSI at NHS in advance of the event as prescribed within the dates and deadlines section of this LOI. Each school entered in this meet must compete in all events to be considered for the overall championship. (except NS1 Squad Drill)
3. Every team member must be a JROTC cadet in good standing. Teams may elect to bring additional cadets outside those competing to be spectators only.
4. **Inspectors and Judges.** Although tentative at this time, it is expected that inspectors and judges will be from The Ohio State University, Miami University, Wright State University and the Marine Corps and Navy recruiters.

Coordinating Instructions.

- a) There will be a maximum of one team/per school/per event, except for Color Guard where two may be entered.
- b) Any additions or deletions to schedule for competing teams must be done at the commanders briefing, or the team will not be counted for score.
- c) The drill meet will be held indoors in the High School Thunder-Dome, Bolts Gym and Middle School Gym. ALL DRILL RIFLES WILL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE RUBBER RECOIL BUTT PAD PROTECTORS AND RUBBER STOPPERS ON THE LOWER FERRULE OF THE GUIDON. Teams not complying with this requirement will be disqualified and not allowed to participate. JROTC service issued rifles will be used.
- d) All events will be conducted, governed, and judged IAW reference (a) and (c).
- e) **Changing facilities:** changing facilities will be available in a classroom. However, all Units are requested to secure their equipment, clothing, and valuables. All Units are responsible for cleaning their room and must leave it in the same condition as they found it. **CHECKOUT WITH THE NHS SNSI OR NSI IS REQUIRED PRIOR TO DEPARTURE.**
- f) **Food:** A concession stand will be in operation during the meet. **No food or drink will be allowed in the drill areas, classrooms, or beyond the commons area.** Please ensure your cadets understand and comply with this rule. Meal tickets will be available for pre-sale and for purchase the day of the Meet. Breakfast and lunch meal tickets, available for \$4 EACH, will include a drink, an entrée, and a snack, and will offer a savings off the ala carte price. This option also gives Naval Science Instructors and/or parents the opportunity to ensure that their cadets are getting a full meal during the Meet.
- g) **Entry fees:** All Units are requested to fill out the entry form and return it, with the \$80.00 entry fee or \$10.00 per postal event fee, to the NHS NJROTC Unit by 14 October 2017. Payment should be by check or money order made out to NHS NJROTC. Check must be from a Unit, School, or Bank Draft. **PERSONAL CHECKS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
- h) **Units responsible for:** loss of or damage to their equipment, including weapons, providing their own rifles, and colors. Units will also be responsible for their discipline and policing of dressing areas.
- i) **Disciplinary problems:** any discipline problems involving crowd disorder or vandalism to Northmont Senior High School facilities will result in disqualification of school and teams involved.
- j) **Acceptable Uniform:** The uniform for the personnel inspection and basic drill competition will be Naval Service Uniform (NSU) (Short sleeve shirt and trousers) or equivalent for members of non-Navy JROTC Units. Garrison covers are the only cover authorized during inspection. Nametags are required. Corfam (patent leather) shoes are not permitted (unless that is the standard issue of the military service). Color Guard teams may wear the uniform of their choice, provided it presents a proper military appearance, for their performance. **Substantial points will be deducted for not wearing the NSU or service equivalent.**
- k) At 0830 there will be a commanders brief in room 4100.
- l) All postals must be received at the high school, by mail or hand delivered by 21 October 2017.

5. **Determination of the overall winning Unit:** To be considered for the overall trophy you must enter a team in each of the following events: IDR Platoon Unarmed; IDR Platoon Armed; Color Guard, and Personnel Inspection. **Tiebreakers will be determined in the following manner:**

- (i) For all marching events – **Head Judge overall impression**
Overall impression total of all judges
Head Judges total score

- (ii) Inspection - **Head Judge overall impression**
Overall impression total of all judges
Head Judges total individual cadet evaluations

- (iii) Overall – **Total Inspection Score**
Total Unarmed Drill Score
Total Armed Drill Score

Drill Meet Events

1. **ACADEMIC EXAM** – one event – 1000 point maximum – academic test (provided by NHS, **Postal**)
2. **UNIT PERSONNEL INSPECTION** – one event – 500 point maximum. 14 Cadets total.
3. **DRILL EVENTS** – **Three events** – 1200 point maximum – 400 points per event Armed Platoon Basic Drill, Unarmed Platoon Basic Drill, and Color Guard.
 - a. An unarmed NS1 (first year cadet) Squad Drill is also a part of the competition but does not count towards overall score. Scoring for this event will be 500 points.
4. **ATHLETICS** – **four events** – curl-ups (8 males, 8 females), push-ups (8 males, 8 females), 16 x 100-yd relay (8 males, 8 females), and 8 x 220-yd relay (4 males, 4 females) (**Postal**)
5. **KNOCKOUT DRILLS** – **armed and unarmed knockout drills** – (not scored towards overall totals)
6. **Personnel Inspections.** A personnel inspection will be conducted throughout the competition as per schedule of the team and will be part of the competitive score. This is the only personnel inspection to be conducted. There will not be an inspection prior to each event. 12 cadets plus 1 commander and 1 guidon (with or without the guidon itself) are required to participate in the personnel inspection. **First squad should have 5 cadets including guide-on, second and third should have 4 cadets.**
7. **Drill Procedures.** In accordance with reference (a) and (c), the following procedures will be followed when forming the unit for Platoon/Squad IDR (Armed and Unarmed). There will be a need for unit leaders to “memorize” the drill card, as they will not be handed the card by the senior judge once the report has been received. At that time, they will be asked if there are any questions and if not, exchange salutes and carry on. This procedure must be followed. The unit leader must report in prior to commencing the drill sequence and also report out at the completion of the drill sequence. **Each team has 20 minutes to compete and complete drill critique by judges. SNSI and NSI should be present during this critique time and should discuss areas of concern. However, scores will not be discussed and your discussion with the judges should remain professional.**
8. **Instructions for IDR Platoon Drill.** The armed and unarmed platoon drill teams must have 12 cadets plus a guidon and commander for a total of 14. Both the team and the drill commander will be judged during competition. **MUSICAL ACCOMPANIMENT OF ANY TYPE WILL NOT BE PERMITTED. Rubber stoppers on the bottom of the Guidon are REQUIRED.**
9. **Color Guard Competition**
 - a. Color Guard is a team competition and may consist but is not required of two, four-person teams (two color bearers – national and unit flags- and two rifle bearers). Members may be of any rank or rate and may be used in any position. However, the National color bearer will give commands.
 - b. Drill Procedures: All commands and movements will be IAW reference (a) and (c); the routine is designed to exercise the color guard in most of the movements normally executed by the color guard. The sequence does not necessarily list the proper command, but rather states what is to be done.
 - c. It is highly encouraged to have one Color Guard consisting of NS1’s.
 - d. The performance should be regulated such that eyes right/left, salutes, etc. occur in front of or when passing the inspecting officer.
 - e. Flag Poles Allowed: 2. Color Guards **MUST** utilize one of the following flag and pole combinations:
 1. the JUMS provided 9-1/2’ wooden pole with Battle-Ax
 2. the JUMS provided 8’ or 9’ aluminum pole with Battle-Ax
 3. the JUMS provided 8’ wooden pole with spear tip

10. **NS1 Unarmed Squad Drill**

- a. Will consist of 8 members and 1 commander.
- b. 500 points (**WILL NOT** count towards overall score.)
- c. Drill procedures will be in accordance with reference (a) and (c)
- d. The commander will be required to “memorize” the drill card

11. **Unarmed and Armed Exhibition (NOT PART OF OVERALL SCORING)**

- a. The Unit Cadet Commander should ‘report in’ to the head judge by stating “(school name) N/MC/AF JROTC from (city, state) reporting for (event).” Command of the unit may not be exchanged during the performance.
- b. Exhibition routines consist of stationary and marching drill movements as well as ‘trick’ rifle maneuvers limited only by the imagination and creativity of the drill unit and rules of this instruction. Gymnastic-style movements and ‘splits’ are not allowed. No routine may include steps or moves that are ‘suggestive’ or would reflect poorly on the naval service or NJROTC. No ‘props’ are allowed, including blindfolds, extra rifles, guidon, musical instruments. No cadet may be lifted off the ground at any time. Any maneuver, with or without rifles, that is considered unsafe by the head judge will result in disqualification.
- c. Exhibition teams are to perform between 6 and 9 minutes. One point per second over or under this range is deducted. Timing begins when the first cadet of the unit crosses the entry point and ends when the last cadet crosses the exit point.
- d. The head judge’s position for reporting in and out will be established by the unit cadet commander and may be two different locations.
- e. No blind toss of a rifle is allowed (blind toss is towards the back of the receiving cadet). Rifles should not travel over the head of any cadet that is not the receiver or thrower. ‘Suicide’ maneuvers must have sufficient margin for error to not jeopardize safety and will be graded on precision of movements, not proximity of rifle tosses or spins.
- f. Dropped rifles incur penalty of 5 pt. first occurrence and 5 pt. deduction per occurrence thereafter. A dropped rifle is any rifle that strikes the deck unless it was intentionally designed to do so.
- g. Max penalty for having fewer than the required minimum team members will be 25 pts.
- h. No bayonets are allowed.
- i. In the event of a broken rifle, the cadet should leave the formation, move to the boundary, and be handed a replacement from outside the competition area. Drill rifles sometimes break in a way where its continued usage could become a danger to the cadet, nearby cadets and/or spectators. When this occurs, the cadet may carry the drill rifle but under NO CIRCUMSTANCES should the drill rifle be spun or otherwise moved in a dangerous manner. Cadets may not continue to utilize a dangerously broken drill rifle.
- j. Floor boundaries for exhibition are 85’ x 70’.
- k. Armed drill team commanders must carry a sword or rifle. Unarmed drill commanders may not carry sword or rifle.
- l. If using a sword, the sword may not leave the commander's hand except to return the sword to the scabbard (swords may not be spun or tossed). When using a sword, the drill team commander must remain at least three normal paces away from the head judge and Units must utilize an NJROTC approved drill rifle (MK5, MK6 or Glendale 8.5 lb Drill Rifle, or the new CNET Drill Rifle). Varnishing or chroming the weapon is permissible. Lightweight ‘facsimiles’ and ‘swagger sticks’ will not be allowed in ‘armed’ or ‘unarmed’ competitions.

- m. In Armed events, drill rifle slings are required. Drill rifle equipment may not be removed. They may however be "taped down" during any phase of the competition with BLACK TAPE ONLY! Also, black may be used to repair a broken rifle as well. No white or light colored tape will be permitted anywhere on the rifle. Drill rifles are REQUIRED to have a rubber butt pad.
- n. Although all team members must compete with the same style drill rifle during a given event, teams are allowed to use multiple sets of drill rifles for each team event (example: one set for Platoon Basic Drill and a different set for Platoon Exhibition Drill).
- o. Guides are optional for exhibition drill, but guidon may not be used. Guides will be armed with a rifle for Armed Exhibition and unarmed for Unarmed Exhibition.

12. **Knockout Drill.**

- a. There is no limitation on the number of cadets who may compete. Maximum participation is encouraged. Cadets are eligible to participate in both unarmed and armed knockout competitions. KNOCKOUT COMPETITION WILL COST ONE-DOLLAR PER CADET PER EVENT. Units may prepay for their cadets to participate in knockout.
- b. All orders and movements will be based on procedures in reference (a) and (c). Competition will be conducted in the main gym.
- c. Judges will tell each cadet eliminated the reason for his/her elimination. Sloppy, incorrect or unauthorized execution of movements will be cause for elimination. Decision of the judges is final. When ten or fewer cadets are remaining, then the decision of two judges will be required for elimination.

13. **Air – Rifle Competition** Reference (b) should be reviewed thoroughly prior to the competition. Each team will be made of **four** competitors. Air Rifle competition will be conducted as a postal match and the targets will be mailed so that they arrive by 14 October 2017.

Tie breaker is determined by

- a. **Team with highest individual score**
- b. **Team with highest low scorer**
- c. **Team with most "bullseye"**

14. **Academic Competition. (Postal)** The academic exam will be administered to 10 cadets and will consist of 100 multiple-choice questions with 60 minutes allowed for completion (please use Scantron forms PDP-100 (882-E Compatible) and a #2 pencil). If you do not have required Scantron forms, they will be provided upon arrival. All test questions will come directly from the latest editions of the NS1, NS2, and NS3 tests. Questions may also be asked from the Cadet Field Manual, and the Cadet Reference Manual. The test will also include ten current event questions. The academic competition will be conducted as a postal and the Scantrons will be mailed so they arrive back to Northmont High School no later than 14 October 2017.

Tie breaker is determined by

- a. **Team with highest individual score**
- b. **Team with highest low scorer**
- c. **Team with most current event questions correct**

15. **Athletic Competition (Postal)** The athletic team shall be made up of eight MALE cadets and eight FEMALE cadets. **Please, ensure to include these cadets as part of your 40 cadets for the drill meet.** The athletic competition will be conducted under the supervision of your high school JROTC Instructor. Cadets should have completed sports physical to compete.
- a. The athletic competition will consist of four events (curl-ups, push-ups, 16x100 yd. relay, and 8x220 yd. relay)
 - b. Curl-ups and Push-ups should be performed in cadence of 50 push-ups/curl-ups a min. for 5 mins. (Navy instructors were given a CD during Area 3 In-service Meeting that could be used.) This can also be downloaded from the Navy Nationals website.
 - c. Push-ups should be performed so that the up position the arms are locked and in the down position a fist distance remains between the ground and cadets chest. Curl-ups should be performed so that cadet's hands stay on his/her shoulders, elbows touch mid-thigh in up position, and in the down position shoulder blades touch the ground.
 - d. The 100-yard relay consists of 8 males and 8 females 100 yards apart and in two groups facing each other, order does not matter. A baton should be passed to each team member. Start the relay and stop watch at the same time. Record the elapse time after the 16th runner completes his/her run. The run should be done on a track.
 - f. The 220-yard relay consists of 4 males and 4 females 220 yards apart. Again, begin the stopwatch and the relay at the same time. A baton should be passed to each team member. Record the elapse time after the 8th runner completes his/her run. The run should be done on a track.
 - g. The athletic competition will be conducted as a postal and the score sheets will be mailed so they arrive back to Northmont High School no later than 14 October 2017.

Tie breaker is determined by

- a. **Team with highest individual score**
- b. **Team with highest low scorer**
- c. **Team with most Push-ups**

Personnel Inspection
Information for the Judges and Cadets

1. It is critical that all cadets be graded using the same criteria. The team judged early must be graded with the same standards as the team judged later in the day.
2. Each cadet is assigned a grade from 0 to 25, which is your impression of how that cadet rates on that scale. A specific standard should not be assigned to any specific area such as hair, clean hat cover, shined shoes, etc., since the degree of each infraction must also be considered.
3. The inspection team grade is computed as follows:
 - a. $14 \text{ cadets average} \times 16.4 + \text{Unit Cmdr. Evaluation (90 points)} = \text{Team Score (500 points)}$
4. Listed below are some guidelines, which should be considered in grading each cadet:
 - a. Cover: Cover clean, correct fit; Hat centered on head; Insignia clean and centered; Buttons with eagles vertical; Garrison cover is required for inspection.
 - b. Shirt or Blouse: Clean and pressed; Devices properly placed; Ribbons must be worn correctly and must be clean.
 - c. Class designator stars must be worn ¼ inch above ribbons, centered and ¼ inch apart or attached and a ¼ inch centered above ribbons, with two points down on each star.
 - d. NJROTC patch must be worn 1 inch below the shoulder seam and centered on the NSU shirt and 1 inch below the shoulder seam and centered on all other shirts, blouses and coats.
 - e. Relaxed fit jackets will not be authorized for wear during competitive events, and personnel inspections will not be conducted in relaxed fit jackets.
 - f. Hair: Regulation cut for males. No male ponytails “hiding” inside covers. Expect to execute the command “UNCOVER, TWO.” Female hair may touch but not fall below the lower edge of the collar.
 - g. Earrings: Males, None. Females are authorized to wear only one standard pair of earrings (GOLD OR SILVER BALL), ONE IN EACH EAR LOBE.
 - h. Facial Hair: Beards are not permitted. Mustaches are permitted, but must conform to Navy standards or service standards of the JROTC Branch.
 - i. Belts: All brass shined, belt clean; Buckles must be worn with the clip positioned just to the left of the buckle for males and to the right for females. No anodized brass is authorized.
 - j. Trousers/Skirts: Proper fit and length; clean and pressed.
 - k. Socks: Male - Black. Female stockings - Neutral color or black, seamless and made of nylon type material.
 - l. Shoes: Regulation style, shined. High gloss spit shined shoes should receive greater credit. Synthetic material is not a regulation Navy shoe and cannot be used by Navy JROTC. However, if synthetic material shoes are the standard issue for other service JROTC units then those specific units will be permitted to use these shoes and will be graded on the condition and appearance. No Corfam shoes will be permitted.
 - m. Overall Appearance: Posture, hands correctly positioned at attention, feet 45-degree angle, eyes straight ahead, etc. Consistency throughout the drill team is expected, particularly in regard to nametags, ties (including knots) and tie clasps, etc.

Note: Each area above is not a specific weight, but contributes to an overall grade of from 0 to 5, with 25 being the highest score. These guidelines are not intended to be all-inclusive. Instructors and coaches, please use your own experience in preparing your cadets for the inspection.

JUNIOR AIR RIFLE COMPETITION (Postal)

Northmont Senior High School NJROTC Field Meet

1. GENERAL. The JROTC air rifle competition will be conducted in the Sport Air Rifle Division. National Standard Three Position Air Rifle rules will govern the competition. It is the responsibility of each participating unit to have a current copy of these rules and to comply with all applicable provisions. Schools are permitted to submit scores for an A and B team, but a team fee of \$10 will only cover the charge of 1 team.
2. ELIGIBILITY. All individuals enrolled in a JROTC high school unit are eligible to participate in this competition. This is a team match, each team consisting of four shooting members. No competitor may be a member of the A and B team.
3. EQUIPMENT. The Daisy Model 853 or its equivalent sport model is authorized for use in the competition. No precision air rifles will be used in the competition. No alterations to the basic air rifle are permitted. No shooting boots or over the ankle shoes, jackets, bicep cuff, or any other equipment will be allowed for this competition.
4. TARGETS. Official NRA 10 meter targets (AR-5/10) will be used. (AR-5/10) Targets and (.177 pellets) ammunition is the responsibility of the individual school teams.
5. POSITION. National Standard Three Position Air Rifle rules apply.
6. COURSE OF FIRE. The course of fire will be according to the National Standard Three Position Air Rifle rules as listed below:

7. RANGE CONTROL. The Chief Range Officer will be designated to supervise all firing. Once firing has started, the match must be completed following the time schedule. There are no provisions for re-firing the match. An incomplete match will be considered a non-entry in the competition.
 8. MATCH ADMINISTRATION. The following general information applies:
 - Each team will be assigned a block of targets with each target numbered (such as 001,002, 003, and 004). Each team member will be assigned 3 targets with one target "P" for Prone, one target "S" for standing, and one target "K" for kneeling. Teams will provide their own targets and send in the targets for grading. Results will be posted at the event.
 - Each shooter will put her/his name, school/unit name and rifle type on the back of each target. Additionally the military instructor will sign and print his/her name on the back of the target.
