1. **Purpose.** To promulgate information concerning the Northmont NJROTC Drill Meet to be conducted on 28 October 2023. Northmont Senior High School sponsors this meet. All correspondence and phone calls can be addressed at 937-832-6010. Messages can be left on voicemail at 937-832-6585. All questions should be directed to the Northmont Senior High School NJROTC Unit. The format of the drill meet will include coaching and teaching for each school participating.

Mail enclosures 2-4 back A.S.A.P or fax 937-832-6037. Scantrons will be sent out to the schools competing in the academics test if you do not have Scantron 882-E or Precision Data Products PDP-100 or equivalent. Let us know if you need these Scantrons ASAP. If not you will be required to transfer your answers to the appropriate Scantron at Northmont Senior High School.

2. **Date.** Saturday, 28 October 2023, from 0900-1600. A commander's brief with all instructors will commence at 0830 in Room 4100. The Judges brief will commence at 0800 and all instructors (only) are invited to that brief. There will not be an opening ceremony. **PLEASE BE PRESENT AND ON TIME.**
3. **Location.** Northmont Senior High School, 4916 National Road, Clayton, Ohio 45315. Enter on the Roadway directly before the Northmont Middle School when traveling westbound. Buses will park in the **bus parking lot** on the **east side of the high school near door 13, behind the middle school.** Cadets will **enter through Door 13.**
4. **Cost.** \$150.00 per school; which includes trophies, medals, and knockout. There is a maximum of one team per event (with the exception of color guard) .
 - If a school cannot make the Meet and just wants to participate in the Air Rifle (two teams maximum), Athletic and/or Academic Postals the cost of each entry is \$20.00 Attending Units postal's are included in your \$150 entry fee and those schools need not pay any extra fees to participate.
 - Money will be used for awards and other competition expenses.
 - Travel expenses are the responsibility of each Unit.
 - Lunch will be provided by the Northmont NJROTC Boosters. The lunch will cost \$8 per lunch.
5. **Berthing.** Berthing is the responsibility of each unit attending the Drill Meet. There are numerous hotels/motels near Northmont Senior High School. The hotels listed below are located near I-70 Main St. exit.

Drill Meet Requirements

1. **OVERALL TROPHIES: ONLY SCHOOLS WHO COMPETE IN ALL OF THE FOLLOWING COMPETITION EVENTS WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR OVERALL TROPHIES:**

- a. Varsity - Personnel Inspection; IDR Armed Platoon; IDR Unarmed Platoon; Color Guard.
 - b. NS1 (defined as any new cadet, this school year, regardless of class NS level) - Unarmed Squad drill, Armed Squad drill, Color Guard, and NS1 Academic Exam.
2. Knock-out, Athletics, Air Rifle, and Academics will not be counted for Overall score.
 3. Units must be identified far enough in advance to allow those chosen sufficient time to:
 - a. Raise the necessary funds to attend the event.
 - b. Meet the minimum paperwork and timeframe deadlines set forth within this LOI. Each school attending must have at most 40

4. Each school attending this event must compete with the minimum requirement of cadets for the drill cards and academic exam. A complete roster of cadets, using enclosure (4), must be submitted to the SNSI or the NSI at NHS

in advance of the event as prescribed within the dates and deadlines section of this LOI. Each school entered in this meet must compete in all events in the respective categories to be considered either the varsity or NS1 overall champion.

5. Every team member must be a JROTC cadet in good standing. Teams may elect to bring additional cadets outside those competing to be spectators only.
6. **Inspectors and Judges.** The inspection deck will be held in the choir and orchestra room. All judges will be Marine Corp Recruiters, Navy Recruiters, Army Recruiters, Air Force Recruiters, and Wright State Army ROTC cadets.
7. **Drill Deck** areas will be in the gyms of Northmont Senior High School. We will run three drill decks (Varsity Drill, NS1 Drill and Color Guard). All Varsity IDR, NS1 IDR and Exhibition will be held in the Thunderbolts gymnasium. Color Guard will be conducted in the Bolts gymnasium.

Coordinating Instructions.

- a) There will be a maximum of **one** team/per school/per event.
- b) Any additions or deletions to the schedule for competing teams must be done at the commanders' briefing or else the team will not be counted for score.
- c) ALL DRILL RIFLES WILL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE RUBBER RECOIL BUTT PAD PROTECTORS AND RUBBER STOPPERS ON THE LOWER FERRULE OF THE GUIDON. Teams not in compliance with this requirement will be disqualified and not allowed to participate. JROTC service issued rifles will be used.
- d) All events will be conducted, governed, and judged IAW reference (a) and (c).
- e) **Changing facilities:** There are several public bathrooms in the building. However, all Units are requested to secure their equipment, clothing, and valuables. All Units are responsible for cleaning up the bathrooms after they have completed changing, ensuring all hangers, drycleaning bags, etc are either thrown away or taken with them. In addition, Northmont Senior High School will provide a classroom for each unit to use, as needed.
- f) **Food:** We will update this tab as soon as the information is handed down to me and I will send out that info via email.
- g) **Entry fees:** *New this year - we have included Knockout in our overall price.* All Units are requested to fill out the entry form and return it, with the \$150.00 entry fee or \$20.00 per postal event fee (Attending Units ONLY pay the \$150.00), to the NHS NJROTC Unit by 20 October 2023. Payment should be by cash or check made out to NHS NJROTC. If a check please make sure it is from one of these a Unit, a School, or a Bank draft.
- h) **Units responsible for:** loss of or damage to their equipment, including weapons, providing their own rifles, and colors. Units will also be responsible for the discipline and policing of dressing areas.
- i) **Disciplinary problems:** any disciplinary problems involving crowd disorder or vandalism to Northmont Senior High School facilities will result in disqualification of school and teams involved.
- j) **Acceptable Uniform:** The uniform for the personnel inspection and basic drill competition will be Naval Service Uniform (NSU) (Short sleeve shirt and trousers) or equivalent for members of non-Navy JROTC Units. Garrison covers are the only cover authorized during inspection. Name Tags are required. Corfam (patent leather) shoes are not permitted (unless that is the standard issue of the military service). **Substantial points will be deducted for not wearing the NSU or service equivalent.**
- k) There will be a commander's brief at 0830 in room 4100 at Northmont Senior High School.
- l) All Postals must be received at Northmont high school by mail by 20 October 2023 or hand delivered to a Northmont Instructor at the drill meet.

8. **Determination of the overall winning Unit:** To be considered for the Varsity overall trophy you must enter a team in each of the following events: IDR Platoon Unarmed; IDR Platoon Armed; Color Guard, and Personnel Inspection. **Tiebreakers will be determined in the following manner:**

- (i) **For all marching events –**
 - Head Judge overall impression**
 - Overall impression total of all judges**
 - Head Judge’s total score**

- (ii) **Inspection -**
 - Head Judge overall impression**
 - Overall impression total of all judges**
 - Head Judges’ total individual cadet evaluations**

- (iii) **Overall –**
 - Total Inspection Score**
 - Total Unarmed Drill Score**
 - Total Armed Drill Score**

To be considered for NS1 overall trophy, you must enter a team in each of the following events: Unarmed Basic Squad Drill; Armed Basic Squad Drill; Color Guard and the Academic test.

 - Head Judge’s total score**

- (v) **Inspection -**

Drill Meet Events

1. **ACADEMIC EXAMS -**
 - a. **Varsity ACADEMIC EXAM – One Event** – 1000 point maximum – academic test (provided by NHS, **Postal**)
 - b. **NS1 ACADEMIC EXAM** - One Event conducted in person at the event - 700 point maximum + bonus points for finishing early
2. **UNIT PERSONNEL INSPECTION – One Event** – 500 point maximum. 20 Cadets total.
3. **DRILL EVENTS (Varsity and NS1) –**
 - a. **Varsity - Three Events** – 1200 point maximum – 400 points per event Armed Platoon Basic Drill, Unarmed Platoon Basic Drill, and Color Guard.
 - b. **NS1 - Three Events** - 1200 point maximum – 400 points per event Armed Platoon Basic Drill, Unarmed Platoon Basic Drill, and Color Guard.
4. **ATHLETICS – Three Events** – curl-ups (8 males, 8 females), push-ups (8 males, 8 females), and 16 x 100-yd relay (8 males, 8 females) (**Postal**)
5. **KNOCKOUT DRILLS – Armed and Unarmed Knockout Drills** – (not scored towards overall totals)
6. **Personnel Inspections.** A personnel inspection will be conducted throughout the competition as per schedule of the team and will be part of the competitive score. This is the only personnel inspection to be conducted. There will not be an inspection prior to each event. 18 cadets plus 1 commander and 1 guidon (with or without the guidon itself) are required to participate in the personnel inspection. **First squad should have 7 cadets including guide-on, second and third should have 6 cadets. Third squad must consist of only first year cadets.**
7. **Drill Procedures.** In accordance with reference (a) and (c), the following procedures will be followed when forming the unit for Platoon/Squad IDR (Armed and Unarmed). There will be a need for unit leaders to “memorize” the drill card, as they will not be handed the card by the senior judge once the report has been received. At that time, they will be asked if there are any questions and if not, exchange salutes and carry on. This procedure must be followed. The unit leader must report in **prior** to commencing the drill sequence and also report out at the completion of the drill sequence. **Each team has 15 minutes to compete and complete drill critique by judges. SNSI and NSI should be present during this critique time and should discuss areas of concern. However, scores will not be discussed and your discussion with the judges should remain professional.**
8. **Instructions for IDR Platoon Drill.** The armed and unarmed platoon drill teams must have 12 cadets plus a guidon and commander for a total of 14. Both the team and the drill commander will be judged during competition. **MUSICAL ACCOMPANIMENT OF ANY TYPE WILL NOT BE PERMITTED. Rubber stoppers on the bottom of the Guidon are REQUIRED.**
 - a. **NS1 Squad Drill: Squads will have 6 members plus 1 commander and with no guidon**
9. **Color Guard Competition**
 - a. Color Guard will consist of two teams; one is a varsity Color Guard and the other will consist of first year cadets. Color Guard is a four-person team (two color bearers – national and unit flags- and two rifle bearers). Members may be of any rank or rate and may be used in any position. However, the National color bearer will give commands.
 - b. Drill Procedures: All commands and movements will be IAW reference (a) and (c); the routine is designed to exercise the color guard in most of the movements normally executed by the color guard. The sequence does not necessarily list the proper command, but rather states what is to be done.
 - c. The performance should be regulated such that eyes right/left, salutes, etc. occur in front of or when passing the inspecting officer.
 - d. Flag Poles Allowed: 2. Color Guards MUST utilize one of the following flag and pole combinations:
 1. the JUMS provided 9-1/2’ wooden pole with Battle-Ax
 2. the JUMS provided 8’ or 9’ aluminum pole with Battle-Ax
 3. the JUMS provided 8’ wooden pole with spear tip

10. **NS1 Squad Drill (Armed and Unarmed)**

- a. Will consist of 6 members and 1 commander.
- b. 500 points (Counts towards NS1 overall score.)
- c. Drill procedures will be in accordance with reference (a) and (c)
- d. The commander will be required to “memorize” the drill card

11. **Knockout Drill.**

- a. There is no limitation on the number of cadets who may compete. Maximum participation is encouraged. Cadets are eligible to participate in both unarmed and armed knockout competitions.
- b. All orders and movements will be based on procedures in reference (a) and (c). Competition will be conducted in the gym.
- c. Judges will tell each cadet that has been eliminated the reason for his/her elimination. Sloppy, incorrect or unauthorized execution of movements will be cause for elimination. Decision of the judges is final. When ten or fewer cadets are remaining, then the decision of two judges will be required for elimination.

12. **Air Rifle Competition** Reference (b) should be reviewed thoroughly prior to the competition. Each team will be made of **four** competitors. Air Rifle competition will be conducted as a postal match and the targets will be mailed so that they arrive by 20 October 2023.

Tie breaker is determined by

- a. **Team with highest individual score**
- b. **Team with highest low scorer**
- c. **Team with most “bullseyes”**
- d. **Individual ties determined by individual with most “bullseyes”**

13. **Academic Competition. (Postal)** The academic exam will be administered to 10 cadets and will consist of 100 multiple-choice questions with 60 minutes allowed for completion (please use Scantron forms PDP-100 (882-E Compatible) and a #2 pencil). If you do not have required Scantron forms, they will be provided upon arrival. All test questions will come directly from the latest editions of the NS1, NS2, and NS3 textbooks. Questions may also be asked from the Cadet Field and Reference Manual. The test will also include ten current event questions. The academic competition will be conducted as a postal and the Scantrons will be mailed so they arrive back to Northmont High School no later than 20 October 2023.

Tie breaker is determined by

- a. **Team with highest individual score**
- b. **Team with highest low scorer**
- c. **Team with most current event questions correct**
- d. **Individual ties determined by most correct current event answers**

14. **NS1 Academic Exam: (Inperson at the event) - 7 total cadet NS1's** will be graded on a timed 20 question exam. The exam will consist of matching and multiple choice questions with a maximum time of 10 minutes. The exam will cover Orders to the Sentry, Chain of Command, Unit 1 of the NS-1 Textbook and Current Events from the past 90 days. This is a 10 minute timed exam, 5 points per correct answer; however bonus points will be added to the team's base score for teams finishing before 10 minutes. The time bonus will be 5 points for every 15 seconds remaining when the last team member turns in his/her exam. For example, if the last member of Team “X” turns in his/her test in 8:20 (1:40 remaining) with 80 total correct answers, Team “X” will receive 400 points for their correct answers and 30 bonus points for a total of 430 points. Then Team “Y” last member turns in his/her test in 3:35 (6:25 remaining) with 75 correct answers, Team “Y” will receive 375 points for their correct answers and 125 bonus points for a total of 500 points.

Tie breaker is determined by

- a. **Team with highest individual score**
- b. **Team with highest low scorer**
- c. **Team with most current event questions correct**
- d. **Individual ties determined by most correct current event answers**

15. **Athletic Competition (Postal)** The athletic team shall be made up of eight MALE cadets and eight FEMALE cadets. **Please, ensure to include these cadets as part of your 40 cadets for the drill meet.** The athletic competition will be conducted under the supervision of your high school JROTC Instructor. Cadets must have a completed sports physical to compete.
- a. The athletic competition will consist of three events (curl-ups, push-ups, and 16x100 yd. relay)
 - b. Curl-ups and Push-ups should be performed in cadence of 50 push-ups/curl-ups a min. for 5 mins. (Navy instructors were given a CD during Area 3 In-service Meeting that could be used.) This can also be downloaded from the Navy Nationals website.
 - c. Push-ups should be performed so that in the up position the arms are locked and in the down position a fist distance remains between the ground and the cadet's chest. Curl-ups should be performed so that the cadet's hands stay on his/her shoulders, elbows touch mid-thigh in up position, and in the down position shoulder blades touch the ground.
 - d. The 100-yard relay consists of 8 males and 8 females 100 yards apart and in two groups facing each other, order does not matter. A baton should be passed to each team member. Start the relay and stop-watch at the same time. Record the elapsed time after the 16th runner completes his/her run. The run should be done on a track.
 - e. The athletic competition will be conducted as a postal and the score sheets will be mailed so they arrive back at Northmont High School no later than 20 October 2023.

Tie breaker is determined by

- a. **Team with highest individual score**
- b. **Team with highest low scorer**
- c. **Team with most Push-up**

16. **Brain Brawl**

1. **BACKGROUND.** Northmont High School NJROTC will host a "Brain Brawl" on Saturday, October 28, 2023. Details include:

- Team size: 4 cadets.
- Date/time of competition: Saturday, October 28th, from 1000 until completion
- Awards: Medals to the top team.

2. **BRAIN BRAWL BASIC FORMAT.** A Brain Brawl is a purely academic competition among cadets given in a game format similar to the TV game shows such as Jeopardy and College Bowl. This competition is single elimination format with each game having a 1st and 2nd place team which will advance to the finals. If there are more than 9 schools then we will have only 3-4 teams compete in 3 elimination games with the highest scoring 2nd place team advancing with the 3 winners.

- Each team competes in at least two preliminary rounds. Each round consists of approximately 15 minutes of toss-up & bonus questions followed immediately by a 2 minute lightning round of toss-up questions only (see paragraph 6). The same number of questions will be asked in each game with the exception of the Lightning Rounds.
- Toss-up questions are from the Cadet Field Manual, the Intro to Naval Science and the NS2 and NS3 textbooks plus current events.
- Bonus questions are earned by successfully answering a toss-up question and are trivia questions on a wide range of topics.
- Questions are NOT multiple choices but instead require a verbal response from contestants.

- Each contestant has a buzzer. Questions are read aloud with contestants offered the opportunity to “buzz-in”. Responses are taken in the precedence of those that “buzzed-in” until a correct response is obtained or time expires.
- The scores of the top teams will be reset to Zero at the beginning of the final round.
- The top team from the final round will receive the uniform medal for each participating cadet (4)

3. **SCHEDULE:** An in-brief will be conducted for each game of 4 (or 3 teams based on number of schools as noted above) with group 1 at 1000 and 2nd group will start at 1100. The final round will be conducted at 1300. All games will be conducted in room 4101.

4. **TEAM COMPOSITION.** Each school’s team will consist of a maximum of four cadets. For example, an NS3 may substitute at halftime for an NS3 or NS4, but not an NS2 or NS1. Of the four competing cadets, at least one must be an NS1 cadet and only one may be NS4 cadet. Other than these restrictions, any combination of cadets is allowed. A 10 point total system will be used, NS1=1, NS2=2 etc. with the total team points not to exceed 10. Each team must have four cadets.

5. **Scoring.**

- **Points:** 10 points per correctly answered question by the team designated to answer via the order for which each team “buzzed in”. -5 points for any incorrect answer. Bonus points are awarded as 5 points per correct answer with no negative points; 20 points max.
- **Semi-Final Round.** After the first 2 groups have completed, the winner and 2nd place team from each advances to the finals. If there are more than 9 schools then we will have only 3-4 teams compete in 3 elimination games with the highest scoring 2nd place team advancing with the 3 winners.
- **Final Round.** The final championship round will follow lunch. No scores will carry over to the final round; all four teams will start at zero in the championship round. The final round will be identical to the previous round with increasingly more difficult questions. The highest scores in points will determine the place of finish with only the 1st place team receiving the uniform medals.
- **Ties.** In the event of any tie that needs to be broken after the qualification rounds, the first tiebreaker designating a winner will be the team with the least experienced team of cadets as listed above in the 10 point, team composition matrix. This does happen, so plan carefully! A final toss-up question(s) will decide a second tiebreaker or until a winner is determined. A winner will be determined when a team buzzes in with the correct answer.

6. **QUESTIONS.**

- **Toss-up questions.** All toss-up questions will be Naval Science questions from the NS textbooks and materials to include current events. Each toss-up question will be read aloud to all four teams until an individual cadet buzzes in. Once a cadet buzzes in, the emcee will stop reading the question and give five seconds for the individual to answer.
- **Correct and incorrect answers.** A correct answer to a toss-up question earns 10 points for that team and a bonus question will then be read for the team that answered the toss-up question correctly. An incorrect toss-up answer will deduct 5 points from that individual’s team score and preclude that cadet from answering that question again. No team total will fall below zero. If the first answer for the toss-up is incorrect, any other cadets who have buzzed in will be given the opportunity to answer the question in the order that they buzzed in. Should none of those cadets get the question right, the emcee will continue to read the toss-up question in its entirety. As the emcee continues to finish the question, remaining cadets may attempt to answer. If no correct answer is given by any team five seconds after the emcee has finished the question, the emcee will verbally state the correct answer and proceed to the next toss-up question.

- **Bonus questions** will be awarded to the team that correctly answers a toss-up question. Each team will have 15 seconds to verbally confer with one another after the question has been read. Each team must designate a team captain who must give their entire answer at the end of the time limit. Bonus questions will be a four-part answer worth a total of 20 points with each answer being worth five points. For example, if three correct answers were given out of a possible four, the team would be awarded 15 points for three out of four correct answers. A new toss-up question open to all four teams will follow if there is time permitting.

7. **UNIFORMS.** There is no prescribed uniform for this event however, at a minimum, all cadets from each school should be dressed the same. No formal inspection will take place, but cadets should meet NJROTC grooming standards.

17. If time Permits an unscored Exhibition Piece will be allowed before knockout. This event could range from a solo act to a platoon sized exhibition piece. THIS IS NOT FOR SCORE!

1. It is critical that all cadets be graded using the same criteria. The team judged early must be graded with the same standards as the team judged later in the day.
2. Each cadet is assigned a grade from 0 to 25, which is your impression of how that cadet rates on that scale. A specific standard should not be assigned to any specific area such as hair, clean hat cover, shined shoes, etc., since the degree of each infraction must also be considered.
3. The inspection team grade is computed as follows:
 - a. 20 cadets (12 varsity, 6 NS1s, Guidon, and Commander) average x 16.4 + Unit Cmdr. Evaluation (90 points) = Team Score (500 points)
4. Listed below are some guidelines, which should be considered in grading each cadet:
 - a. Cover: Clean, correct fit; Centered on head; Insignia clean and centered; Buttons with eagles vertical; Garrison cover is required for inspection.
 - b. Shirt or Blouse: Clean and pressed; Devices properly placed; Ribbons must be worn correctly and must be clean.
 - c. Service Stars: Must be worn ¼ inch above ribbons, centered and ¼ inch apart or attached and a ¼ inch centered above ribbons, with two points down on each star.
 - d. NJROTC Patch: Must be worn 1 inch below the shoulder seam and centered on the NSU shirt and 1 inch below the shoulder seam and centered on all other shirts, blouses and coats.
 - e. Relaxed Fit Jackets: **Will not** be authorized for wear during competitive events, and personnel inspections will not be conducted in relaxed fit jackets.
 - f. Hair: Regulation cut for males. No male ponytails “hiding” inside covers. Expect to execute the command “UNCOVER, TWO.” Female hair may touch but not fall below the lower edge of the collar.
 - g. Earrings: Males, None. Females are authorized to wear only one standard pair of earrings (GOLD OR SILVER BALL), ONE IN EACH EAR LOBE.
 - h. Facial Hair: Beards are not permitted. Mustaches are permitted, but must conform to Navy standards or service standards of the JROTC Branch.
 - i. Belts: All brass shined, belt clean; Buckles must be worn with the clip positioned just to the left of the buckle for males. No anodized brass is authorized.
 - j. Trousers/Skirts: Proper fit and length; clean and pressed.
 - k. Socks: Male - Black. Female stockings - Neutral color or black, seamless and made of nylon type material.
 - l. Shoes: Regulation style, shined. High gloss spit shined shoes should receive greater credit. Synthetic material is not a regulation Navy shoe and cannot be used by Navy JROTC. However, if synthetic material shoes are the standard issue for other service JROTC units then those specific units will be permitted to use these shoes and will be graded on the condition and appearance. No Corfam shoes will be permitted.
 - m. Overall Appearance: Posture, hands correctly positioned at attention, feet 45-degree angle, eyes straight ahead, etc. Consistency throughout the drill team is expected, particularly in regard to nametags, ties (including knots) and tie clasps, etc.

Note: Each area above is not a specific weight, but contributes to an overall grade of from 0 to 5, with 25 being the highest score. These guidelines are not intended to be all-inclusive. Instructors and coaches, please use your own experience in preparing your cadets for the inspection.

JUNIOR AIR RIFLE COMPETITION (Postal)

1. GENERAL. The JROTC air rifle competition will be conducted in the Sport Air Rifle Division. National Standard Three Position Air Rifle rules will govern the competition. It is the responsibility of each participating unit to have a current copy of these rules and to comply with all applicable provisions. Schools are permitted to submit scores for an A and B team, but a team fee of \$20 will only cover the charge of 1 team.
2. ELIGIBILITY. All individuals enrolled in a JROTC high school unit are eligible to participate in this competition. This is a team match, each team consisting of four shooting members. No competitor may be a member of the A and B team.
3. EQUIPMENT. The Daisy Model 853 or its equivalent sport model is authorized for use in the competition. No precision air rifles will be used in the competition. No alterations to the basic air rifle are permitted. No shooting boots or over the ankle shoes, jackets, bicep cuff, or any other equipment will be allowed for this competition.
4. TARGETS. Official NRA 10 meter targets (AR-5/10) will be used. (AR-5/10) Targets and (.177 pellets) ammunition is the responsibility of the individual school teams.
5. POSITION. National Standard Three Position Air Rifle rules apply.
6. COURSE OF FIRE. The course of fire will be according to the National Standard Three Position Air Rifle rules as listed below:

<u>RULE NUMBER</u>	<u>RULE</u>
5.3.2	10 shots in each position; prone, standing, and kneeling in that order
5.3.2	Shooting time, including sighting shots, is 18 minutes prone, 20 minutes standing, and 15 minutes kneeling
5.5.1	Air rifle target for 10 meters
7.10	Dry firing is allowed only during the preparation period and competition as long as a propelling charge is not released
7. RANGE CONTROL. The Chief Range Officer will be designated to supervise all firing. Once firing has started, the match must be completed following the time schedule. There are no provisions for re-firing the match. An incomplete match will be considered a non-entry in the competition.
8. MATCH ADMINISTRATION. The following general information applies:
 - Each team will be assigned a block of targets with each target numbered (such as 001,002, 003, and 004). Each team member will be assigned 3 targets with one target “P” for Prone, one target “S” for standing, and one target “K” for kneeling. Teams will provide their own targets and send in the targets for grading. Results will be posted at the event.
 - Each shooter will put her/his name, school/unit name and rifle type on the back of each target. Additionally the military instructor will sign and print his/her name on the back of the target.
